We train and collaborate with agricultural workers in communities facing vulnerabilities related to poverty, climate shocks, and slow-onset disasters. We work with them to identify agricultural solutions to increase crop yields and further strengthen communities' food security.



When women are given the opportunity to generate income, it impacts the economic standing of their families and communities. We partner with women to help develop sustainable resources which they can leverage to make more strategic, independent life choices.

Highly regarded for our scalable response and distribution model, we utilize our eight international warehouses, four domestic warehouses, a specialized disaster response fleet, and a highly-trained team of staff and volunteers to respond quickly and effectively.



At our Community Events, thousands of Guests of Honor receive free groceries, health and dental screenings, haircuts, family portraits, hot meals, job and career services, and much more. These events strengthen communities by meeting the immediate needs of local families and creating opportunities for future collaboration between local entities.
