

## Solomon's Story

The civil war in Ethiopia began nearly two years ago. The conflict has forced 13 million Ethiopians to need food assistance. Blocked roads are keeping vital aid from reaching communities, putting tens of thousands of children at immediate risk of death. Drought and food prices — exacerbated by the war in Ukraine — are affecting 20 million people in the Horn of Africa region.

Solomon is one of those people.

As a teenager, he's watching his country struggle. But he has experienced his own tragedies that could have derailed his life completely. Solomon lives with his father, but his mother left him when he was 2 years old. She also took his elder brother with her.

"I want to bring my parents together," he said. "If I could get the chance to change one thing, I would definitely bring my mother and elder brother to live with me."

Even though Solomon's father works hard to provide for them, his age and health keep him from earning much money. Solomon admits they often went without food and didn't have suitable shelter.

"I feel sad. I feel like I don't have a family. I wonder why this happened to me."

Despite their difficulties, his father always brought them back to one wise thought: Have good character and don't give up, because one day things will change.

Thankfully, Solomon connected with a Convoy of Hope Children's Feeding program center that ran through his school. He began receiving



regular, nutritious meals, and his father didn't have to struggle to keep him fed. Solomon has a keen interest in engineering and architecture, and he has every intention of joining an engineering college when he graduates.

"Sometimes I feel privileged to have free breakfast and lunch, which I have been getting," he said. "I am thankful for that."



## QUICK TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- We recommend that people in leadership engage with the *One Day to Feed the World* campaign. When you express your heart for the poor and suffering, you will send a powerful message about the DNA of your church.
- Choose the length of your campaign. We recommend 2 to 3 weeks. Consider using a holiday, such as Easter, Mother's Day, Thanksgiving, or even Super Bowl Sunday.
- If you haven't already, visit convoyofhope.org/oneday to order materials and download videos.
- A Set a goal for everyone to participate! As you know, your church members will likely rise to any challenge your leadership sets for them. If your church held a *One Day* fundraiser last

- year, consider asking them to meet or exceed what they gave last year.
- Encourage your church to choose a specific day at work to wear their *One Day* sticker. Our hope is that it sparks opportunities to share with others about the good work they are doing through Convoy of Hope.
- Give the entire congregation an update on how much was raised following your *One Day* campaign. Celebrate the good work you did together!
- Call your Convoy of Hope representative if you need additional ideas or encouragement. We're here to serve you.

## 4-WEEK SERIES EXAMPLE

#### WEEK 1

- Show a video.
- Distribute the handouts and stickers.
- Ask your church members to consider giving.
- Announce the giving date.

#### WEEK 2

- Show another video.
- Ask your congregation to share why your church cares about the poor and suffering within their circles of influence.
- Remind them of the giving date.

#### WEEK 3

- Show a third video.
- Distribute giving envelopes.
- Collect the donations.

#### **WEEK 4**

- Announce how much your church generously gave.
- Celebrate the difference they made!
