Lagina's strong work ethic and her love for her children are staples of her character. That's why the hardest days of her life were the days she came home empty handed, having to tell her children that there was nothing to eat.

"No matter how hard I worked, it was never enough," she said. "It led them to have no hope."

Then a new opportunity came and Lagina was quick to accept.
